WATER RESOURCES' REPORT

Bill West reported to Samuel B. Potter prior to the meeting that Alsbury Reservoir will not be able to store any water this year. Currently Alsbury Reservoir is not at dead pool. Wendy Ryan will open the outlet as soon as weather permits.

HYDROLOGISTS' REPORT

Water Watch and Augmentation reports were provided and discussed. Snow levels are extremely low. Rifle Creek and Divide Creek are still on active calls and the Colorado River went on call 4/14/21.

CRYSTAL RIVER

Wendy Ryan discussed some of the requirements for aquifer recharge, diverting water from the Crystal River to higher areas to slowly seep back into the river. Recharge is not the same as a reservoir and would require intense monitoring devices. Some potential areas for recharge would be Lower Avalanche Creek, Redstone and Lower Coal Creek, downstream of Chair Mountain Ranch and downstream of Marble. Aquifer recharge would need to occur during the months of April thru June. 30+ acre feet of recharge per month would be necessary to meet peak augmentation demands of 0.5 cfs and 50+ acre feet of recharge per month would be necessary to meet proper timing needs of the 0.5cfs.

West Divide needs to reach out to the Crystal River users and the media with a current status update. Wendy will try to get something put together soon.

SITE VISITS

Wendy will go out next week for more yield study readings, current conditions prohibited accurate measurements and installs.

Wendy will close the outlet at Alsbury reservoir soon and will visit Martin Reservoirs to make sure there are no issues with the reservoirs filling.

ATTORNEY'S REPORT

Received written and oral report from counsel.

NEW BUSINESS

The next meeting is scheduled for May 20, 2021.

We are pleased to confirm our understanding of the services we are to provide West Divide Water Conservancy District for the year ended December 31, 2020.

Audit Scope and Objectives

We will audit the financial statements of the governmental activities, the business-type activities, each major fund, and the aggregate remaining fund information, and the disclosures, which collectively comprise the basic financial statements of West Divide Water Conservancy District as of and for the year ended December 31, 2020. Accounting standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS) provide for certain required supplementary information (RSI), such as management's discussion and analysis (MD&A), to supplement West Divide Water Conservancy District's basic financial statements. Such information, although not a part of the basic financial statements, is required by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board who considers it to be an essential part of financial reporting for placing the basic financial statements in an appropriate operational, economic, or historical context. As part of our engagement, we will apply certain limited procedures to West Divide Water Conservancy District's RSI in accordance with GAAS. These limited procedures will consist of inquiries of management regarding the methods of preparing the information and comparing the information for consistency with management's responses to our inquiries, the basic financial statements, and other knowledge we obtained during our audit of the basic financial statements. We will not express an opinion or provide any assurance on the information because the limited procedures do not provide us with sufficient evidence to express an opinion or provide any assurance. The following RSI is required by U.S. generally accepted accounting principles (GAAP) and will be subjected to certain limited procedures. but will not be audited:

- 1) Management's Discussion and Analysis
- 2) Budgetary Comparison Information for General Fund

We have also been engaged to report on supplementary information other than RSI that accompanies West Divide Water Conservancy District's financial statements. We will subject the following supplementary information to the auditing procedures applied in our audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS, and we will provide an opinion on it in relation to the financial statements as a whole in a report combined with our auditor's report on the financial statements:

1) Budgetary Comparison Information for Enterprise Funds

The objectives of our audit are to obtain reasonable assurance as to whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error; issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion about whether your financial statements are fairly presented, in all material respects, in conformity with GAAP; and report on the fairness of the supplementary information referred to in the second paragraph when considered in relation to the financial statements as a whole. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements, including omissions, can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment of a reasonable user made based on the financial statements.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

We will conduct our audit in accordance with GAAS and will include tests of your accounting records and other procedures we consider necessary to enable us to express such opinions. As part of an audit in accordance with GAAS, we exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.

We will evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management. We will also evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements, including the disclosures, and determine whether the financial statements represent the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation. We will plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement, whether from (1) errors, (2) fraudulent financial reporting, (3) misappropriation of assets, or (4) violations of laws or governmental regulations that are attributable to the government or to acts by management or employees acting on behalf of the government.

Because of the inherent limitations of an audit, combined with the inherent limitations of internal control, and because we will not perform a detailed examination of all transactions, there is an unavoidable risk that some material misstatements may not be detected by us, even though the audit is properly planned and performed in accordance with GAAS. In addition, an audit is not designed to detect immaterial misstatements or violations of laws or governmental regulations that do not have a direct and material effect on the financial statements. We will also conclude, based on the audit evidence obtained, whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the government's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our procedures will include tests of documentary evidence supporting the transactions recorded in the accounts, tests of the physical existence of inventories, and direct confirmation of receivables and certain assets and liabilities by correspondence with selected customers, creditors, and financial institutions. We will also request written representations from your attorneys as part of the engagement.

Audit Procedures—Internal Control

We will obtain an understanding of the government and its environment, including internal control relevant to the audit, sufficient to identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to error or fraud, and to design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks and obtain evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinions. Your responsibilities include acknowledging to us in the representation letter that (1) you are responsible for presentation of the supplementary information in accordance with GAAP; (2) you believe the supplementary information, including its form and content, is fairly presented in accordance with GAAP; (3) the methods of measurement or presentation have not changed from those used in the prior period (or, if they have changed, the reasons for such changes); and (4) you have disclosed to us any significant assumptions or interpretations underlying the measurement or presentation of the supplementary information.

You agree to assume all management responsibilities for the financial statement preparation services and any other nonattest services we provide; oversee the services by designating an individual, preferably from senior management, with suitable skill, knowledge, or experience; evaluate the adequacy and results of the services; and accept responsibility for them.

Guest column: Drain Lake Powell, Not Colorado Farms

Experts agree the amount of water in the Colorado River basin has declined because of drought and climate change, and that population growth is fueling demand for water higher and higher. One result is the level of Lake Powell in Arizona, behind Glen Canyon Dam, has steadily declined and is now at 43% of capacity. Further, just last week, the U.S. Dept of Interior sounded an alarm that they may have to start draining other reservoirs in Colorado, New Mexico, and Wyoming to try and "save" Lake Powell.

As with any water crisis, advocates and government officials work overtime to come up with solutions that will meet their narrow needs. These solutions have traditionally met the needs of the water establishment at the expense of taxpayers and the environment.

The present crisis has added a new group whose "ox will be gored" - Colorado farmers.

In addition to draining Colorado reservoirs to try and save Lake Powell, the new proposal being pushed by the water establishment, called "demand management", would pay farmers to not farm, and instead send that farm water down to Lake Powell.

This Rube Goldberg solution is seriously flawed in multiple ways.

First, the proposed "demand management" program wants to buy just 500,000 acre feet of water from farmers to store in Lake Powell in an attempt to save the Lake. However, simple back-of-the-envelope math dictates that 500,000 acre feet of water is woefully deficient. In fact, federal law requires that an average of 8.23 million acre feet of water be released from Glen Canyon Dam every year to flow down through the Grand Canyon, which is 22,548 acre feet per day. Thus, the extra storage of 500,000 acre feet proposed by demand management would only last 22 days when federal law requires the water to be sent downstream.

Second, and related to the previous point, Lake Powell has been losing around 400,000 acre feet of water per year for the last 20 years due to drought and climate change. Predictions this year, so far, are even more dire. We've seen no indication whatsoever that leasing and storing 500,000 temporarily, just one year, would even remotely stem the tide of water legally required to be released from Lake Powell by Glen Canyon Dam.

Third, proponents of demand management – which includes the State of Colorado Water Conservation Board – constantly say that demand management would be "voluntary, temporary, and compensated". Let's look at each word carefully

- "Voluntary": 500,000 acre feet of water would require around 500,000 acres of farms to be dried up do you expect to see that many farmers "volunteering" to get paid to stop farming, even if it's for only one year?
- That leads to the second point, "Temporary": No climate science or scientist that we've seen, heard, or read and we pay close attention has ever said climate change will be "temporary". As such, the water would have to be leased year after year, or bought, to permanently buy-and-dry the farms in Colorado. Saying the program is "temporary" is climate denial at best, or an outright lie at worst.
- "Compensated": No source of money at all has been identified local, state, or federal to try buy out all of the Colorado farms to send their water to Arizona to try and save Lake Powell.

Finally, at the same time that the State of Colorado and other proponents push demand management to send water downstream, the exact same people and agencies are promoting more dams and diversions in Colorado to divert more water out of the river! In fact, the same State of Colorado Water Conservation Board supports at least four new projects that would divert a new 80,000 acre feet of water out of the river every year. As such, the State is taking two steps backwards for every one step forward that tries to save Lake Powell.

Colorado farmers deserve better. They shouldn't be singled out to carry the burden of propping up Lake Powell to meet the narrow and parochial needs of the water establishment.

The construction of Glen Canyon Dam was, and still is, one of the most controversial issues in American environmental history. Demand management is a half-baked idea to try and save an outdated dam and lake that never should have been built in the first place.

Whiting column: Colorado River Compact adjustments are needed

Legislation may need to be adjusted to maintain its validity.

The passage of time, a change in need, the wisdom of hindsight, practicality and fairness can all create the necessity for adjusting legislation if it is to continue to be effective and accomplish its intended purpose.

The Colorado River Compact is a prime example. When signed in 1922, the Colorado River drainage was divided into two divisions; Upper: Colorado, Wyoming, New Mexico, Utah; Lower: Arizona, California, Nevada. At that time, it was felt the total average annual flow was 16.4 million acre feet. As a result, each basin was assigned 50%, or 7.5 million acre feet, with the 1.4 million acre feet surplus allocated to Mexico.

As a result, the Upper Basin is obligated to provide 7.5M acre feet to the Lower Basin, regardless of the actual flow of water in any given year. Obviously, snowpack and the consequent flow is not a constant and years of drought and low flows create a problem for the Upper Basin. Any year generating less than 15M acre feet means that the Upper Basin may be required to make do with less than their 7.5M share to guarantee the Lower Basin's 7.5M.

This has become an annual, not an occasional problem. According to the Bureau of Reclamation, the average annual flow from 2000-2018 was 12.4M, compared to the expected 16.4M. This means the Upper Basin may have to make do with 4.9M if the Lower Basin is to receive their 7.5M. Lake Mead and Lake Powell were created as an effort to mitigate the effect of low water years and help provide the Lower Basin 7.5M without having to reduce the Upper Basin, but over 18 years of lower flows have reduced their levels to 50% of capacity requiring the Upper Basin to reduce their usage.

There is a provision for Lower Basin reduction to 7M acre feet in a year of extreme drought, but according to the Bureau of Reclamation that reduction has yet to be implemented. Going to 7M would still necessitate an Upper Basin reduction to 5.4M during the average 12.4M year.

This Upper Basin drought period doesn't seem to be ending, but rather accelerating. Consequently, future years will require actual restriction in usage in the Upper Basin to fulfill their mandated Lower Basin guarantee of 7.5M.

The cause is irrelevant, because any solution is long term, and the effect is now. An immediate change in weather pattern will take many years to eliminate the problem. The Bureau of Reclamation estimates it would take 13-15 years of 20% increase in flows to refill the two reservoirs. Probably not a good bet.

Reducing usage by an average of 2.5M acre feet will require reduced river flows negatively affecting fish and wildlife. 33% less water would be available for agriculture, manufacturing, and domestic use. Beyond inconvenience, the economic effects would be obvious and devastating.

Beyond our current emphasis on equity, it is hardly fair for the Upper Basin to have to bear the entire hardship, especially given we are the source of the water. Even in times of scarcity, farmers aren't asked to take food off their personal table. There is a logical solution available.

Given that the original premise was a 50% division, why not maintain that percent but base it on actual water availability. If 12.4M acre feet are generated this year, for example, then 6.2M is available for each Basin. Hardship isn't eliminated but at least shared equally. If a great water year, over the 15M, happens to occur, the 7.5M share is maintained so the surplus would help refill the two reservoirs. A simple and fair solution.

Sadly, simple and fair hasn't usually been a common motivator for legislative or regulatory change. This solution would not sit well with politicians from the Lower Basin. They would try to wield the hatchet based on their having a population almost five times the Upper Basin (51M to 11M).

It is hard to defeat 500% more potential voters, but we must try.

It's a solution that would be easy to determine as well as implement. An allocation based on reality would not only be more workable but more realistic, equitable with shared hardship or surplus.

There are meetings scheduled this summer to further discuss Colorado River Compact adjustments necessitated by drought. The time is right to make this logical change.

Water issues are here and not going away. It is our personal responsibility to advocate for an equitable way to work the problem until solutions to the drought have time to take effect.

No blarney: State approves up to \$75 million for water projects, fire-scarred watersheds

Colorado's fire-scarred mountainsides, small-town water districts, drought-stricken rivers and ranches, and the Colorado Water Plan will see a one-time cash infusion of \$32 million to \$75 million under a bipartisan stimulus program approved by Gov. Jared Polis and Colorado lawmakers last week.

The Colorado Recovery Plan

- , as it is known, sets out a \$700 million spending plan that includes funds for transportation, education and small businesses, among others, and also includes:
- +\$10 million to \$25 million for wildfire recovery and risk mitigation;
- +\$10 million to \$20 million for projects identified under the Colorado Water Plan;
- +\$10 million to \$25 million for mountain watershed restoration; and
- +\$2 million to \$5 million for agricultural drought response.

In hard-hit cities such a Glenwood Springs, where last summer's Grizzly Creek fire came close to destroying its mountain water system, the cash could help the city's multi-million-dollar effort to rebuild its water treatment plant and other projects.

"The details aren't clear yet," said Glenwood Springs City Manager Debra Figueroa, "but we absolutely plan to look into it."

For groups that have been working for years to establish a permanent source of funding for the Colorado Water Plan's myriad projects and programs as well as stream and watershed restoration projects, the funding is expected to provide a much-needed boost.

"The good news is that this will reach projects all over the state," said Bart Miller, healthy rivers program director at Western Resource Advocates and member of the Water for Colorado Coalition. "I think it's going to be money well spent. It's one-time, but it's going to have a big impact for the water plan and drought [mitigation]."

The Colorado Water Conservation Board oversees the water plan.

"We don't yet have any plans in place to determine how the funding would impact our programs," said spokesperson Sara Leonard. "Watershed funding is of course needed for post-fire mitigation needs, and we also look forward to working with the legislature on how funding can be put to the best use."

The recovery plan also allocates millions of dollars for rural communities and the ranches and cattle operations that have struggled during the pandemic and persistent drought conditions.

"Agriculture has been hard hit by the drought, and we do need more money for water projects," said Gene Manuello, an Eastern Plains rancher near Sterling.

But Manuello said the sprawling spending plan raised questions in his mind about whether the state was spending money too freely.

"I'm a Republican and I am, in general, not in favor of these kinds of government stimulus programs," he said.

The \$700 million recovery program is being funded by a better-than-expected recovery in state tax revenue collections. Last year as the pandemic swept the country, shutting down businesses and government offices, Colorado **slashed \$3.3 billion** (https://www.denverpost.com/2020/05/12/colorado-budget-economy-coronavirus/)

from the state budget, anticipating that it would take several years before tax revenues recovered enough to restore state spending.

But the turnaround came faster than expected, allowing lawmakers and the governor to jump-start infrastructure work and job creation in order to help the state recover faster.

Western Resource Advocates' Miller said the \$32 million to \$75 million will be useful for dozens of groups and communities.

"I'm very encouraged," Miller said. "It's a great opportunity."

All reservoirs are filled and the Atkinson Ditch-Martin Reservoir exchange will be operated to continue to keep them all full.

The Division of Water Resources did not honor the Doose Ditch call. The possibility of this call would have called out all of the reservoirs and would have required reservoir releases to augment contractees upstream of the Doose Ditch.

YIELD STUDY

All transducers have been installed except for Cache Creek and that will be installed Friday afternoon.

The forest service cut down some trees that may shift reference elevations on East Divide. Wendy will continue to evaluate and shift data accordingly if need be.

BUDGET MESSAGE WEST DIVIDE WATER CONSERVANCY DISTRICT 2022 BUDGET

The District was organized by decree of the District Court, in and for Garfield County, Colorado, on April 10, 1964, for the purposes of conserving and developing land and water resources for the greatest beneficial use of water within the District boundaries. The District has broad statutory powers concerning the conservation and utilization of water resources within its boundaries which include portions of Garfield, Pitkin and Mesa counties.

The District has **four** individual budgets for the calendar year beginning on the first day of January **2022**, and ending on the last day of December **2022**: General Fund Budget, General Stored Water Enterprise Fund Budget, Fourmile Creek Enterprise Fund Budget, and Silt Interconnect Enterprise Fund Budget.

The District's budgets are prepared using a current financial resources measurement focus. This means that the modified accrual basis of accounting is employed in that only current assets and current liabilities are considered for budgetary purposes in the District's governmental (General) fund. In addition, adjustments may be necessary to reconcile differences in budgetary reporting and financial statement reporting in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles (GAAP) in each of the District's Enterprise funds. The District's annually appropriated budgets for each of its Enterprise funds may include amounts for bond or loan proceeds, debt principle payments or capital outlay expenditures which must be considered when reconciling to GAAP basis financial statements.

As increases may have been made in the expenditures, similar increases have been added to the revenues, so that the budget remains in balance, as required by law.

GENERAL FUND

The General Fund provides for director, legal, accounting, administrative and hydrology expenses of the District. Budgeted expenditures for the 2022 General Fund are \$251,032 This is a \$10,897 decrease from last year, funded by property tax on a mill levy of .039. The three enterprise funds provide a portion of the revenue from reimbursable disbursements.

GENERAL STORED WATER ENTERPRISE FUND

This fund was originally created and budgeted in 1994 to operate and maintain the augmentation program in the Colorado River. The Fund is generated through project revenues and interest earnings. The budgeted expenditures for the General Stored Water Enterprise Fund are \$2,987,703.

FOURMILE CREEK ENTERPRISE FUND

This fund was created in 1994, and budgeted in 1995, to operate and maintain the augmentation program in the Fourmile Creek area near Glenwood Springs, Colorado. The fund is generated through project revenues. The budgeted expenditures for the Fourmile Creek Enterprise Fund are \$192,886.

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SILT INTERCONNECT ENTERPRISE FUND

This fund was created in 2005, funded and operational in 2006, to operate and maintain the augmentation program in the Silt Mesa area of Garfield County, Colorado. The fund is generated through project revenues. The budgeted expenditures for the Silt Interconnect Enterprise Fund are \$197,764.
